


Albert Albert ZENT-GYÖRGYI

In the early 20th century, researchers, including Hungarian scientist Albert Szent-Györgyi, isolated a substance called 'hexuronic acid' from adrenal glands and later from paprika. In 1932, American chemist Charles Glen King identified this compound as the anti-scurvy factor found in citrus fruits, renaming it ascorbic acid (from Latin 'scorbutus,' meaning scurvy). Szent-Györgyi's further work on Vitamin C earned him the 1937 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine. This discovery revolutionised nutrition ு of vitamins in human health. science, highlighting the importance

Katalin Karikó is a Hungarian-American biochemist who attended the University of Szeged where she earned her Bachelor's Degree, in Biology in 1978 and her Ph.D. in Biochemistry in 1982.

Her research laid the foundation for the development of mRNA-based vaccines, including those used to combat COVID-19.

Katalin Karikó was awarded the Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine in 2023. During a lecture at the University of Szeged, the biochemist revealed her plans to donate a replica of her Nobel Prize to the university, along with over \$500,000, which will be allocated to support exceptional teachers and students.
